Scenarios

Description: Now that you've defined the key use cases your product will support, it's time to start imagining how it will play out over time. Scenarios are a way to begin verbally exploring how time and context will come into play with your product, and act as a script for visualizing the user's experience, or storyboarding.

Scope

Base all of your work on the topic of your current project; use your evolving research and thoughts from the project class to drive this work.

For each of the use cases defined in Assignment 1, write a scenario

1. Define the primary user in the scenario.
2. Define the context of use for the product, also considering what happens before the product (the trigger) and after the product (the outcome).
3. Describe, in a few paragraphs, what the user will do along the way. Refine multiple times. Remember that you do not need to include every step from your use case in a scenario; focus on the steps that make your product unique or important, or on those that are critical to the use accomplishing their goal.
4. Break paragraphs into manageable steps or chunks, each demonstrating an important snapshot of your product. Think of each step as a "frame" in the storyboard you will be building for Assignment 3.

Scenarios. For each use case, one descriptive scenario documented in an organized manner. (100 points)
